We will run the mock exams in the style of the external examinations therefore the following rules will apply:

### Instructions for Students

Assemble outside the Sports Hall 15 minutes before the examination is due to start.

- You must write only in black ink (fountain pen or ball point pen), except for drawings and rough notes.
- Make sure that you bring whatever equipment you need for each exam e.g. pens, pencils, ruler, calculator etc. You cannot have pencil or calculator cases on or at your desk. Equipment may be carried in a transparent pencil case.
- If you use a calculator:- make sure it works properly; make sure the battery is working properly; clear anything stored in it; do not bring into the exam room any operating instructions or prepared programs.  
You must not take into the exam room any unauthorised equipment or materials that may give you an unfair advantage. This includes notes, bags, personal stereos, iPods, reading pens, MP3/4 players, or any other products with digital/text facilities. Make sure that mobile phones are turned off and left in your bag or coat. **You are not allowed to have a mobile phone, or any other electronic device, on you during an exam. If you are found to have a phone, or electronic device, on you (even if it is turned off), you will be disqualified from that exam.**
- Bags and coats will be placed at the side of the exam room. You will then be shown where to sit by a member of staff.

No student will be allowed to leave the exam hall until the end of an examination.

You will not be allowed to go to the toilet during an exam unless it is an emergency.

Food is not allowed in the exam hall. You may have a small bottle of water with you but the label must be removed from it prior to the exam.

- At the end of an examination remain silent as the exam papers are collected and until you leave the exam room.

### REMEMBER

- Make sure you organise your time for revision and be prompt for all exams. You are responsible for all your own arrangements.
- When you have finished your exams please leave the exam room quietly as other Years have normal classes.
