#### **Broadening Horizons**



In October and November Year 10 pupils had the opportunity to attend a Broadening Horizons session supported by members of our fantastic Alumni network, Bucks Fire and Rescue Service, and staff from Ringway. The aim of the session was to give pupils time to discuss job opportunities and routes into jobs with a range of guests from a variety of sectors and to make them aware of different roles within an organisation. We actively encouraged pupils to ask questions, listen carefully to the answers and then ask follow up questions to improve their understanding of the roles being discussed. We are running 2 more sessions in March for the remainder of year 10.

All pupils in years 7 and 8 are now logged onto Unifrog and we encourage them to use the platform regularly as it is a mine of information for all things career related. Especially about different routes into work. The yr 8 curriculum is to learn and explore different pathways. During the year 8 sessions pupils played a game of Careers Jenga. The pupils had to ask each other questions; good answers allowed them to take a block away. This was to develop their confidence when speaking to people they might not know very well and to successfully complete the activity they had to apply employability skills such as problem solving, teamwork and adaptability. We would like to remind parents that they can also log onto Unifrog at home.

The process for parent accounts have changed and we are working collaboratively with Unifrog on a relaunch for parents in the New Year. Please keep an eye on our socials and school website.

#### **Work Experience**

Year 10 pupils will be completing their work experience in January and will have the opportunity to develop all the employability skills during their placement. This year the placement is for 2 weeks, which is certainly more of a challenge. However, many pupils have been very proactive, risen to the challenge and have found 2 oneweek placements. With 280 students looking for two weeks' work experience, we are left with 7 placements still to source. The careers team have increased their WEX sessions in the library to help and guide students in a bid to make sure that every student has a meaningful work experience placement

They will have a WEX booklet to complete and this will give them the opportunity to reflect on how they have been able to apply their employability skills in the workplace.

Following the launch last month of WEX for Year 12, they have thrown themselves into looking for placements, with many students keen to find places that align with their future aspirations such as apprenticeships. WEX sessions will begin after Christmas and resources have been shared with parents and students to help in the meantime.

We have noticed that because of previous events they have attended the older pupils are much more confident talking to people and seem to come to the Fair keen to find out about pathways available to them and opportunities locally. #### STEM X



Team work



STEM X is an educational program run by Oracle Red Bull Racing and Milton Keynes College, which uses Formula 1 to teach science, technology, engineering, and maths to children aged 9 – 14. It combines theoretical knowledge with practical application through activities like the 'Pit Stop' Challenge, STEM racing, and design challenges.

STEM X relates to the broader concept of STEM education and its vital role in developing critical skills, fostering innovation, and preparing students for high – demand careers. It fosters lifelong curiosity by developing persistence and adaptability.

It also encourages problem solving, creativity and communication skills that are essential in a rapidly evolving world and transferable across all aspects of life.

We were also selected to appear on **BBC Look East** to advertise the work the College and Red Bull are doing to promote STEM.
