As we move towards the midpoint of the academic year we have a lot to celebrate in the Careers department. We have delivered careers activities for all pupils from Careers Fairs to In **Person Workouts** alongside the arrangements for work experience, introducing Unifrog across the school and much more.



In Person Workouts



In October over 30 different guests came into school to deliver In Person Career Workout sessions for all of Year 8. This was the first time since lockdown that we have been able to have guests coming into school. It was a great success, and we are very grateful to Worktree for organising and facilitating this amazing opportunity for our Year 8 pupils.

The feedback from the guests was very positive and they commented on how friendly and engaged the pupils were and that they were a credit to the school. Pupils commented that they "liked that everyone had different jobs and journeys" and that they "found out things they didn't know before".



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Raising Aspirations

One of the aims of the Raising Aspirations programme is to introduce pupils to local Universities and again we took nearly 100 pupils to visit Northampton University. It offered them the opportunity to see what university life is like as well as valuable information about courses and student finance. Over the coming academic year we will be visiting Bucks New University and Oxford Brookes.

Feedback from staff and pupils was very positive: Pupils "It was a really worthwhile experience, I got to find out about University and life as a student" and "I wasn't thinking of coming to University but now I definitely want to go."

Mrs Dalkin, Year 11 tutor "The pupils got so much out of the visit, it was great to see them growing in confidence as the day went on."


We have also had members of the Alumni network in to deliver talks to pupils about careers and opportunities.

This continues to be an enormous task, but we are very pleased to say the vast majority of Year 10 pupils found placements and had a very successful work experience.

Approximately, a third of the year managed to secure their own placements and we secured placements for the other 200 pupils.

Just before the end of term we organised a day to help pupils prepare for WEX and as part of the day we had guests in to share their experience of work with the pupils.

Current Year 9 will go out on WEX in January 2026 and we would strongly recommend they start thinking about researching placements and try to secure a placement as soon as possible.

Careers Fair

Just before the end of term, we held a Careers Fair.

We had 30 different companies and universities attend and pupils were encouraged to visit different stands and find out as much as they could about apprenticeships, degree courses and job opportunities.

The majority of pupils felt it was a worthwhile event and that it introduced them to the different pathways available to them after Year 11.

The Fair was for Year 11 and Post 16 pupils and we invited parents to the session at the end of the school day. There were over 100 confirmed attendees for the event but unfortunately numbers were much smaller on the day. If you have time could you email us at
