Dear Families

I was delighted to join with our whole school to take part in our Remembrance Mass on Tuesday morning. It was extremely moving and a powerful opportunity to pray for those who we no longer see. Children participated in a prayerful and reverent way and the music was superb. I am grateful to Fr Emmanuel for celebrating Mass for us. Later on Tuesday afternoon, we held our Remembrance service and two minutes silence. It was a very moving experience and a joy to participate in. A group of students took part in a Red Bull Racing STEM X event on Thursday, and you may have seen them on the BBC last night as it was filmed by BBC Look East. A very exciting opportunity for our students! A huge thank you to our fantastic Careers team for facilitating this opportunity and well done to all the students who took part in the filming with such confidence and enthusiasm. Today, Network Rail visited our school and worked with Year 8 students. The students took part in group activities and problem-solving challenges. We started Maths Week today and will be celebrating further with many activities next week. We marked Anti-Bullying Week with lots of thought-provoking activities and wearing odd socks on Monday. We are proud of our Maths Ambassadors, who have created the prize packs and will be volunteering throughout the week to support activities, lead problem-solving sessions, and act as role models for younger pupils. Can I please remind parents to take great care with where they park, especially when collecting children after school.
