Dear Families

It has been much calmer here at St Paul's this week. We began the week with a Silver Duke of Edinburgh expedition to the Dunstable Downs from Monday to Wednesday. Also on Monday, our RE team took students to St Thomas More School in Bedford for a Pilgrims of Hope conference for the Jubilee year. On Tuesday pupils supported at the St Thomas Aquinas Sports Day, and again at Bishop Parker's on Thursday. On Wednesday we held a Careers Fair for Years 9, 10 and 12 and Year 10 Geographers went out on Geography fieldwork on Wednesday and Thursday. Also, on Thursday Years 7 to 9 pupils went to Trent Bridge to the Test Match. On Wednesday and Thursday Year 10 and 12 Drama students and Year 10 English students went to MK Theatre to see An Inspector Calls. On Monday a group of Year 10 are going on a visit to Loughborough University. The next day another group are off to Oxford Brookes University for a visit. On Wednesday we welcome Year 5s from our Catholic primary schools for the start of their annual taster days. This is an important part of our recruitment and familiarisation so that families are ready to select St Paul's as their child's secondary school and continue their education within a Catholic School. On Thursday and Friday our Bronze Duke of Edinburgh candidates are going on a practice expedition to Cosgrove Park. I hope the weather is kind!
