## **Dear Families**

We have had a very busy end to the Lent Term here at St Paul's. Our Lent fundraising has gone into overdrive this week! Thank you to all parents and carers for your 'behind the scenes' support of our many fundraising activities. On Tuesday the Drama department hosted a 'Voices of the Holocaust' event. This was extremely thought-provoking. On Thursday Year 12 & 13 Historians visited Hampton Court Palace in the beautiful sunshine. They were treated to a lecture from Historic Royal Palace's Chief Historian and author Tracy Borman who was kind enough to take the time to discuss Tudor history, take questions and inspire our students with her passion for history. Most Year Groups experienced Easter rewards celebrations this week and it was a joy to see so many children being praised and rewarded for their consistent effort and achievement. Governors also held an admissions appeals panel to respond to the significant number of appeals for places at St Paul's Year 7.

On Monday afternoon, Student Council members and Student Leaders met with the SCITT trainee teachers to explain to them what student leadership looks like at St Paul's. Students took turns going through a PowerPoint presentation to the group discussing their personal development and how they help in the local, school, and wider community.

On Wednesday afternoon, Student Leaders visited the MK Storehouse to drop off the school's donations for the local charity. Shoes, clothes, coats, and suitcases were all donated from children and staff here at St Paul's which will go to those in need in the Milton Keynes community. Our students were very pleased to be able to assist the local community and to see the work that MK Storehouse is doing. Students really did 'love, serve, and do the best that is possible' as St Paul calls us to do! Student Councillors have also spread joy by delivering cakes and thank you cards to our Faculty Admin and Site teams.

Congratulations to our Year 11 Basketball team who played against Lord Grey and won 82 - 36. .All players scored and brought the St Paul's "Do the best that is possible" with them to the game. They were focused on the formidable task of winning the Championship at a neutral venue. Our Year 10 team narrowly lost 43 - 48 to Watling Academy in their close fought final and finished in second place in Milton Keynes. Well done to both our teams.

Z & S buses have advised us that they are planning to phase out the PDF printed QR code tickets in an attempt to ensure that bus tickets are only used by the student that has purchased them. In this way, all tickets purchased through the school portal will be directly linked to the student's Smartcard.
