
We would like to thank parents for their support in ensuring that their children have been in correct school uniform over the last term. We acknowledge that this has not necessarily been the easiest of tasks especially with the restrictions caused by Covid having been in place.

We have sent a number of reminders out to parents over this time informing parents of what will be the uniform expectations in September. We have also spoken to the pupils in their tutor time in the hope that parents are not put in the position of having to make additional cost to replace any item of clothing that is deemed not to be correct uniform. You will find diagrams below of what is correct uniform and PE kit to support you in the buying of any uniform over the summer. These will also feature in the pupil planners from September but we felt it would be advantageous to make them available to you now.

Could parents please pay particular attention to these guidelines when buying skirts and trousers and shoes. Please do not assume that because a shop may advertise skirts, trousers and shoes as items of school uniform that these conform to the uniform requirements at St Paul's. If you are in any doubt, please contact school.



**<u>Trousers</u> must be made out of black material and have no raised stitched seams, exposed zips, buttons or other attachments. Jeans, cargo style, jeggings or leggings are not appropriate. <u>Black tailored shorts</u> can be worn in the second half of the Pentecost term up until the end of September.
