- Take an **active part** in all aspects of their child's education and supporting them with learning that happens at home.
- Attend all** meetings relating to their child's education and welfare.
- Communicate with members of our community with **dignity and respect**, remembering that we are all working together for the good of the child.

Students agree to:

- Take **responsibility** for their own **behaviour** by making good decisions.
- Take **responsibility** for their own **learning** through **thinking hard** and being **active participants**. **Do the best that is possible** in all lessons.
- Wear the **correct uniform** and attend school and lessons with **correct equipment** and with PE kit on the correct days.
- Care** for our **common home** by respecting the school environment.
- Communicate with members of our community with **dignity and respect**, remembering that we are all working together for the **common good**.

School agrees to:

- Intentionally plan learning** that **challenges** every child to **think hard** and to **do the best that is possible** in their learning. Provide **feedback** that moves learning on quickly and effectively.
- Maintain high standards of **uniform** and expect all pupils to be **correctly equipped**.
- Model **Christ's** example of **love** and **forgiveness** in all interactions, ensuring that the **dignity** of the individual is preserved at all times.

Love | Serve | Do the best that is possible



- Being determined to DO THE BEST THAT IS POSSIBLE in everything we do to enable us to fulfil our ministry.




We have a responsibility to strive to be the very best versions of ourselves for God and for others.




We must always promote inclusion, celebrate diversity and educate all to treat others with dignity & respect, recognising that we are all unique and made in God's image.
