### Step Up to Sixth Form, orientation:

After you have finished your exams you'll be provided with Step Up learning for the sixth form subjects you have chosen to study. You'll also attend an orientation day and taster sessions for your courses.

### Results day and enrolment:

Enrolment to courses will be confirmed after your results day. If you didn't quite meet the entry requirements you'll be provided additional bespoke advice and guidance to find the right course for you before the start of the new academic year.

### Entry requirements:

Different courses have different entry requirements. The GCSE and Vocational results you earn will determine the pathways available to you at sixth form. As well as these overall entry requirements, most courses have specific entry requirements noted overleaf, *in green*.
